Com. Dembowski reports in the telegram no. 44 on 1 this month:

Your 399.

1. They confirm their interest in the furthering of relations. They believe that some of the DP's experiences deserve careful examination and might be inspiring to the CDL.

2. They would like to receive Młyńczak with great distinction. They noted that in the first half of April they are going to be entirely consumed with the session of the new NPC, [and the] session of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference. They consider the eventuality of a visit in the IIIrd decade of April.

They ask about the composition of the delegation and our wishes about the agenda and the route.

3. They reported that the League and other democratic parties participate in the enlivened discussion about the new role of the United Front in the political life of China.
