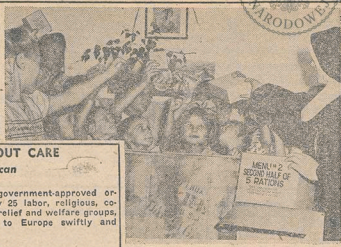

CARE Food Packages are Welcome Gifts in Poland



CARE PACKAGES ARRIVE: Longshoremen unload a ship from America, bringing a bulk shipment of CARE food packages to Poland. As part of CARE's unique delivery system, there are now 60,000 such packages warehoused throughout Poland, available for immediate delivery when orders are placed for them in the United States. William C. McDonald, Chief of CARE's Mission to Poland, in Warsaw, reports that CARE has the use of SPOLEM warehouses "within walking distance of almost everyone in Poland."



A GALA DAY: It's a gala day for the 200 orphan girls in the orphanage and school of the Sisters of Mary's Family, at Pludy, near Warsaw, when CARE packages arrive from America. Each of the packages contains sugar and candy, the first they've ever tasted, in addition to 29 pounds of other nutritious food.

FACTS ABOUT CARE

Cooperative for American Remittances to Europe

CARE is a non-profit, government-approved organization established by 25 labor, religious, cooperative and accredited relief and welfare groups, to send food packages to Europe swiftly and safely.

"The Big Package"

CARE food packages weigh 49 pounds and contain 29 pounds of nutritious hard-to-get food amounting to 40,000 calories. (Regular food packages to Europe are limited to 11 pounds.)

Delivery Guaranteed

Delivery of CARE packages is guaranteed. When you place your order in the United States, your order form is airmailed to CARE headquarters in Poland. A signed receipt is obtained with delivery, and mailed back to you.

No Red Tape

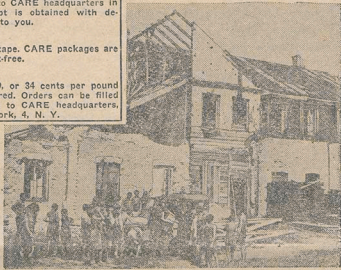
CARE cuts through red tape. CARE packages are duty-free, ration-free, tax-free.

Complete Cost

Total cost now only \$10, or 34 cents per pound of balanced food, delivered. Orders can be filled out in person or mailed to CARE headquarters, 50 Broad Street, New York, 4, N. Y.

A BIG TURNOUT: The boys at the orphanage and school of the Sisters of Mary's Family at Pludy, near Warsaw, turn out en masse when the CARE jeep drives up to their ruined building, to bring them CARE food packages sent from America. The jeep is the temporary object of interest for these youngsters, but a few minutes later they forget the jeep altogether and turned their full attention to the candy bars found inside the CARE packages.
