TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
THE KOREAN QUESTION

The African Youth Command of Ghana notes with the utmost dismay the continued statement in the apathy of the American Administration to the implementation of the 1975 U.N. resolution on Korea.

We are hereby openly charging that in the supreme interest of World Peace the U.N. raises as a matter of urgency to the peoples of South East Asia and in the fulfillment of the general desire of the entire Korean people and the peace loving peoples throughout the world, with the Carter Administration to abandon its delaying intrigues in the total pull-out of U.S. troops from South Korea in view of the urgent demand issuing from the present development of times to preserve peace in Korea and realisation of the independence and peaceful reunification of Korea.
