PROPOSALS

by the Delegates from Hongkong and Macao

PROPOSAL FOR ORGANIZATION OF ASIAN FEDERATION

I. REASONS

The two big powers of the world today are: the United States of America which represents the free and democratic nations of the world, and the Soviet Union which is identified with the words tyranny and aggression. The nations in Western Europe are making efforts to create the European Union for their survival. The Schuman Plan for pooling of coal and steel settled the problems of the European nations arising from the utilization of the most important resources in that area; the NATO brought a success for their collective actions both in military and economic affairs; these two organizations laid two keystones prerequisite for the European Union. In order to adapt ourselves to the world situation, it is an urgent question for us to form an Asian Federation.

II. MEANS

1. All the peoples' delegates participating in the present Conference will sponsor "the Preparatory Committee for Asian Federation".
2. The term for the Preparatory Committee will be indefinite, until decided in later days in consideration of the actual situation of the Asian countries.
3. The duties of the Preparatory Committee will be, besides of conducting the business of general affairs, to prepare draft for organization of Asian Federation within two years.
4. In order to meet the need to resist the communist aggression at

the present transitional period, an Asian Alliance should be formed immediately.

PROPOSAL FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF RECEPTION PLACES IN THE VICINITY OF THE IRON CURTAIN TO MAKE THE STAFF MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNIST COUNTRIES AND THEIR PEOPLE RETURN TO THE FREE WORLD

I. REASONS

Disasters the communist parties inflicted upon their people are the unheard-of in history. No freedom of speech or thought exists, nor can it be granted in the communist countries. Therefore, the staff members of the communist party and the people are looking for every chance to flee to the free world. In order to force the communist camp to collapse, it is necessary to initiate a movement to enable members of the communist party and the people to return to the free world. Therefore, reception places should be set up in the vicinity of iron curtain to stimulate their aspiration to seek shelters in the free world.

II. MEANS

1. Propaganda will be strengthened so that the staff members of the communist party and the people behind of the iron curtain may return to the free world if they so desire.

2. Reception places will be set up at key locations in the vicinity of the iron curtain in Asia.

3. Reception places in all areas will be under the command of the proposed Department of Psychological Warfare, Headquarters of Asian Peoples' Anti-Communist League.

4. The people who are returning to the free world will be given political asylum and means of living through the business they desire to take up.

5. Provisions on the Organization and management of the reception places will be prescribed separately.

PROPOSAL FOR STRENGTHENING ANTI-COMMUNIST ASIAN WOMEN'S CAPABILITIES

I. REASONS

Women are those who mostly suffered from the prolonged arbitrary rule of the communists. Their potential capabilities did not yet assume the shape by systematic organization. This is one of the shortcomings in the anti-communist front at the present time. It is, therefore, necessary to meet the urgent needs we are facing with strengthening of the anti-communist women's capabilities.

II. MEANS

1. Within the proposed Headquarters of the Asian Peoples' Anti-Communist League, there will be established a Department of Mobilization of Women, which should be a supreme organ to lead the women engaged in the anti-communist struggle.

2. The Department of Mobilization of Women will bring the women's leaders of all countries together to create "Asian Women's Anti-Communist Association" by which the anti-communist movement of women will be unified in their actions.

3. A daily paper or monthly periodical to be known as "Asian Women" will be issued to guide the Asian Women for their resistance against communist parties.

4. A Mission composed of women members will be organized and sent to all countries for exchange of opinions and close contact between them.

PROPOSAL FOR STRENGTHENING PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE TO EXPEDITE PROMPT COLLAPSE OF THE COMMUNIST CAMP

I. REASONS

The Soviet-led international communist parties, once they occupy a certain area, lay down iron curtain to cut off the outside world. Thus they boldly behave as they please, exercise oppressive rules and commit

murder to attain their purpose of arbitrary rule.

It is a human desire to be free in their lives, and the more restrained, the more will they resist. It is not easy to control them compulsorily. Although they live in the world cut off by the iron curtain, they are seeking, with all risks they may encounter, for every chance to flee out of the communist world. This was evidenced by the fact that, in recent years, a number of key figures of the communist countries both in Europe and Asia came out to choose freedom. Under these circumstances, the burning question we now have is to strengthen the way of psychological warfare. The proposals stating the means for the above-mentioned aim is hereby submitted below for your consideration.

II. MEANS

1. This Conference will form a permanent organization to be known as "Asian Peoples Anti-Communist League", under which there will be set up a department of psychological warfare to command the whole process of psychological warfare against the communists.

2. In each countries, there will be set up a bureau of psychological warfare to be in charge of the affairs related to psychological warfare.

PROPOSAL TO ORGANIZE "ASIAN YOUTH ANTI-COMMUNIST VOLUNTEER FORCE"

I. REASONS

Though manpower resources in Asia is abundant, the present armed strength of anti-communist camp is much weaker than that of communist camp. Therefore, the most effective and advisable way to reinforce the anti-communist strength is both to enlarge the armed forces of each country to the maximum and to organize Asian Youth Anti-Communist Volunteer Force enlisting young people of each area,

II. MEANS

1. Organization:

a.) "General Headquarters of Asian Youth Anti-Communist Volunteer Force" will be established and a Commander-in-Chief should either be appointed upon request from among prominent generals of the United States of America or be recommended from among the competent military figures of each country in Asia.

b.) Department of Allied staffs will be established in the General Headquarters and the staff will be composed of those belonging to the Volunteer Force of each country.

c.) Branch Headquarters of Volunteer Force will be established in each country and the commander of each country will be appointed from among the prominent generals of each country. Advisors or staffs of one contracting country may be dispatched and assigned to the Branch Headquarters of other contracting country.

2. Composition of man strength will be made up by following means:

- a.) Anti-Communist youths in exile residing in each country.
- b.) Anti-Communist youths escaped from behind of the Iron Curtain.
- c.) Youths and students applying for the enlistment.
- d.) Retired officers and soldiers.

3. Expenditure:

Request will be made to the United States of America to allocate, in the Foreign Aid Programme, the necessary fund for the establishment of Asian Youth Anti-Communist Volunteer Force.

4. Training:

Training center will be set up and mass training will be made.

5. Operation:

Special area will be placed under the control of the Force so as to be capable of swift maneuverings.
