Regarding the medical supplies that will be sent to Korea

The annexed table, which includes the medical supplies that will be sent to Korea for the anti-epidemic campaign, is approved. The necessary funds will be supplemented by the Ministry of Finance.

April 25, 1952

Table with the necessary materials for the anti-epidemic campaign, checked on April 24, 1952

5,000 kg dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethane (DDT) powder

5,000 kg nitroxan oil

2,000 kg insecticide powder

40 Kalimax pumps

10 pumps with bellows for insecticide powder

550 Record syringes

50 Luer syringes

4,000 syringe needles

500 medical thermometers

10 Michel devices

300 liters rectified spirit

700 liters medical spirit

100 liters denaturated alcohol [sic!]

100 kg hydrophilic cotton

400 kg regular cotton

Disinfectants (chloramines, commercial formol)

Anti-malaria [drugs], antibiotics, serums and vaccines (20,000 anti-small pox vaccine vials, 1,500 liters anti-cholera vaccine, 10 liters anti-gangrenous serum, 10,000 anti-tetanus vials, 10 liters anticoal serum, 50 anti-venom vials, 500 anti-exanthematic vaccine vials, 10 liters anti-botulism serum [...]).
