Dear General Taylor:

This office has heard a number of reports to the effect that the Eighth United States Army is considering the release of the Correspondents Billets within the next few months.

Should this be the case, I have been asked to tell you that this Government would like to prepare adequate and moderately priced living quarters for newspaper correspondents in this area. We are wondering if one of the buildings of the Naija Apartments could be made available soon so as to enable the Government to redecorate at least part of the space and have it ready for occupancy as soon as the Army discontinues the services it has so kindly been providing to newspaper representatives in Korea.
