General Taylor recommends that the entire party listed above be invited to Kyung Mu Dai on 24 May to dinner. Additionally, General Taylor suggests that invitations be extended to the following:- Ambassador Briggs, Ambassador Dean, Mr. Wood, General Coulter, and General Hayden.

For your information, Ambassador Briggs plans to have the group to dinner on 25 May and General Taylor will have them for dinner on 26 May. It is not at all necessary that General Taylor and General Anderson be invited to Kyung Mu Dai on 24 May. Mr. Wood, General Coulter, and General Hayden are recommended to be invited on 24 May since the Governors' committee is primarily interested in rehabilitation in Korea.
