Dear Philip:

I am in receipt of a letter from Mr. Goodfellow in which he enclosed a letter from Firth Sterling concerning the construction of a plant for the beneficiation of tungsten ores.

I wish you would inform Firth Sterling that we are setting up a refinery in Korea and therefore I do not believe we would be interested in a proposition to ship the products of our mines to America. We have propositions from companies all over the world and are in the process of comparing them to select the most satisfactory proposal. If Firth Sterling is interested in submitting a proposition on a firm contract or on a commission basis I wish they would forward it to you for transmittal.
