Dear Mr. Yu:

I refer to your letter of 12 February concerning Mr. I. M. Pei.

Arrangements have been made for his clearance to enter Korea, as you requested. Upon his arrival in Japan, Mr. Pei should report to the G-1 Section, Headquarters, Army Forces Far East, Pershing Heights, Tokyo, where the necessary visa will be waiting for him.

This clearance will provide for entry into Korea without logistic support from military sources.
