Dear Mr. Yu:

Arrangements have been made for Mr. O. H. P. King to be billeted temporarily by the Commanding Officer Seoul Military Post (Colonel Kammerer) from 8 February when he will be obliged to vacate the Correspondents billets.

As the Eighth Army has no authority to furnish support to an individual of Mr. King's status, it will be necessary for him to make other arrangements without delay. The billet in the Seoul Military Post is provided only as an emergency measure to be terminated as soon as possible, and not later than 20 February.

Unfortunately, Seoul Military Post does not have suitable accommodations for Mrs. King. However, since she is an accredited correspondent she may remain at the Correspondents billets.
