Dear Mr. Prime Minister:

I should like to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 9 January, referring to the retention of the Chosen Hotel for the use of the Economic Coordinator's Staff. As you point out, this headquarters had hoped to evacuate the property at an early date, as the Chief of Staff indicated to you in his letter of 26 August. However, as early as 7 November; I reported to you the probable need to retain the Chosen Hotel. The subsequent inability to find another solution to Mr. Wood's housing requirements has now made the retention of the Chosen necessary and has resulted in my letter to you of 2 January. I am attaching a copy of my letter to you of 7 November, which may have been overlooked in reviewing this issue.

Meanwhile, if, upon Mr. Wood's return, a more satisfactory arrangement can be worked out, I shall be very glad to assist in its implementation.
