From the President

I wish to thank you for your report No. 76 and am glad that you and your wife had a good trip home.

I am glad to hear that, in your absence, Mr. Chung, acting as Charge d'Affairs ad interim, carried on the duties of the Legation as you would wish.

I have not been able to see our Delegates to the Asian People's Anti-Communist Conference who returned a few days ago. The visit of Mr. Dulles kept us busy over the weekend and yesterday I went to Pusan on an inspection trip. I particularly wanted to see the patients in the Army hospital who had spine injuries. We received some money from Cardinal Spellman and I am thinking of using it to help these veterans.
