Dear Mrs. Kim:

I would be very happy to help you to get some Korean handicrafts brass candlesticks and mats, if I personally had the means to do so. It will be necessary to request some funds from the Foreign Office for furnishings to be made available when your husband comes to Korea so that he may choose the articles you need and arrange for their shipment.

*India* On receipt of his letter, we cabled Mr. Kim to come for consultation before proceeding to ~~Indonesia~~ to attend the Conference and permission was granted for you to accompany him at your expense. As time proved too short for him to first come to Korea, the Foreign Office informed our office he would come to Korea after the Conference to report. You may then like to come to Korea. The weather is rather cold and I know it will be a relief for you from the heat of Manila and the change will do you a lot of good.
