MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

In connection with this Bureau's investigation of the Comintern Apparatus, which includes espionage agents, you have heretofore authorized the establishment, of a technical surveillance on the residence of Mikhail Kalatozov, 4744 Los Feliz Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, telephone Normandie 8363. (S) u

Mikhail Kalatozov has returned to the Soviet Union. [and the Los Feliz Boulevard address is now occupied by [redacted] both of whom are attached to the Soviet Consulate in [redacted] It is known that [redacted] is referred to by the Soviet representatives as [redacted] Inasmuch as all police functions of the Soviets are under the control of the NKVD, I recommend continuance of the technical surveillance previously authorized on the residence at [redacted] for the purpose of determining the extent of the activities of [redacted] [redacted] the Soviet Secret Intelligence Service (NKVD). In this regard, it is anticipated that additional espionage agents may be identified. (S) u
